April showers bring May flowers. Springtime brings restoration, vitality and joy. We have celebrated the Resurrection of Christ by continuing to revel in the Eastertide moments. God is working to make all things new. God works day and night to be steadfast in abiding love. Allowing our spirit to play openly provides opportunities to be open to God's love. The following is an article from Krista Ridlinger-Grosse about the benefits of play:

Our family recently got a dog....or let me rephrase that: I recently got a dog. Our newest addition – named Kobe (not after beef but after basketball) – is an almost six-month ball of endless energy. This morning, as we did our morning walk in (ahem) the rain, I noticed Kobe jumping from the curb to puddle...curb to puddle.... and literally splashing in whatever pool of water he could find. I had to laugh through my annoyed, cold self as I witnessed such uninhibited joy .... it was play.

When was the last time you played? According to Dr. Stuart Brown, a psychiatrist and founder of the <u>National Institute for Play</u>, play is defined as engaging in an activity for enjoyment, rather than for a serious or practical reason. Play has seven properties:



it is apparently purposeless; it is voluntary; there is an inherent attraction to it; while doing it there is freedom from time; it diminishes the consciousness of self; it has improvisational potential (open, not rigid); and it has a continuation desire which makes you want to do it more.

Science has demonstrated that play offers valuable benefits in children and is equally important in adults. Play has been shown to reduce stress, increase happiness and joy, and allow for more adaptive coping through challenging situations. In professional settings, play increases learning, productivity and job satisfaction. Relationships are enhanced by play through increased bonding and communication. Thus, studies have shown that play isn't just about imagination; it is about rest and rejuvenation. It shapes our brain; fosters joy, creativity and innovation: and it is essential to our health.

Take a look at your day and ask yourself, did I play today? During the hustle of your busy life, did you take time to experience uninhibited joy? Whether it's participating in a board game with family, coloring a picture, playing tennis with friends or watching a movie – playfulness can be defined as anything that brings you pleasure and is unattached to an outcome. For me, it may have been a cold walk with Kobe, but it stopped me in my tracks, made me smile and feel just a bit better about standing in the rain.

Experience the joy of new life and new hope. "The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play." Proverbs 22: 6-9


