God continues to take something that is of seeming slough and turn it into great purpose and value. Take, for instance, Tone Balls. A Tone Ball is merely a fancy name for the dust bunnies that tend to collect inside guitar bodies. This ball can remain inside as residue for decades or even centuries. It collects in the cavity of an acoustic instrument such as a violin, viola, cello or bass violin or guitar. The Tone Balls are a creation of the result of the vibrations inside the acoustic instrument. The better the instrument, the tighter the ball. It is made up of lint and other debris that collect inside. The vibrations that create the beautiful sound gather the lint and cause it to collect and spin into a ball.

The presence of the ball is believed to assist in the tone which enhances the vibrations that reach the listening pleasure of the music being created. People will collect these lint balls, and some will even purchase them for their instruments. Who knew!?!

When we consider all that is shed as waste from our lives, we may further repurpose and find value in our past and time as God has. Summer is a time to sweat out the toxins of the building months of the past and spin new joy among you in the play and enjoyment of this season. The season is quick. Discover new ways to collect and create a peaceful tone for future days together. Enjoy each moment!

Council Highlights – June 2022

Your Council met on June 20, 2023. Below are the highlights.

Congregational Retreat Update: Space is still available for members to register for the Daycholah UCC Camp Retreat! The retreat will be held from September 8-10. We currently have 12 people registered and are hoping for more to join us. The deadline for registration has been extended, so be sure to sign up soon! The retreat will be a combination of outside activities such as golf and boating, crafts, campfires, movies, spiritual time and more. Pastor Sara can address any other questions. It will be a great weekend!

Summer Worship Time Change: The worship service time change has been in effect for a few weeks, and many like the "added" hours to their summer Sundays. The Council will continue to monitor attendance at our 8:30 service and will make any changes necessary.

Safety Committee: The Committee has been busy with updates to the current Safety Brochure. In addition, they have set up safety events including armed intruder class, fire/tornado drill and CPR/AED training. These events will take place in October.

Narrative Lectionary: Pastor Sara gave Council a presentation focusing on changes in the Lectionary starting in September. The Narrative Lectionary is a 4-year cycle from September through May, reviewing the Bible in chronological order, starting with the Old Testament until Christmas, then New Testament thereafter. There is a break during Advent and Lent. This change will increase our Bible literacy and includes the children, as well as adults. The Council approved this change to start on Rally Sunday, September 17.

Styrofoam Usage: UCC nationwide had a resolution pass which discontinues the use of Styrofoam in the churches. This product does not disintegrate, and a "greener" alternative should be used. A council member will look into options, and we will move toward this goal as soon as possible.

Werthmann Room: The room is almost ready to re-open! The painters will complete the project soon and we expect it to be re-opened in the later part of July.
