


#### A Message from Pastor Sara:

The church **Safety Committee** has been busy meeting during the spring and summer months. Our goal

was to review the **Emergency Procedures Manual** for the church and make any updates as needed. This has now been accomplished. We also reviewed the **Safety Procedures handouts** that are placed in the hymnal holders in each pew. Several changes have been made to the handouts and new ones will be placed in the pews in the next several weeks.

The committee also discussed the idea of providing some type of review and/or training for the congregation to go along with the handouts. After much discussion, we came up with these dates:

- 1) **Sunday, October 8th** after the **10am** service, an Officer from the Fort Atkinson Police Department will give a short presentation on unsafe/armed intruder. This event will take place in Plymouth Hall.
- 2) **Sunday, October 15th** after the 10am service, we will review the Fire /Tornado Severe Weather /Unsafe Intruder procedures from the Sanctuary.
- 3) **Saturday, October 20th** at **10am**, several members of the Fort Atkinson Fire Department EMS will be in Plymouth Hall **to provide training in CPR and the use of an AED**. This is only going to be basic training in CPR and no test or certification will be offered. There will be a signup sheet in narthex about a month before so we have some idea of the number of members interested in this training.

There is no cost for any of the training, and we hope as many members of the congregation as possible will attend. Thank you!

#### **DAMASCUS PROJECT**

When we look for the best tools to prepare local congregations to be the Church of the future, we instantly think of the **Damascus Project**, the rich educational ministry shared by the Minnesota & Wisconsin conferences of the United Church of Christ. This online learning community helps our conferences expand their capacity for faithful and courageous leadership while connecting people in meaningful, caring relationships where wisdom and knowledge are shared freely.

For lay people, the **Damascus Project offers learning opportunities** designed to enrich the life of faith, build leadership skills and, in some cases, explore authorized ministry. Clergy find space in the Damascus Project for peer support, re-imagination of their ministries and professional development. The Damascus Project provides participants a reminder that they are not alone in their questions or challenges – they are part of the wider family we call the United Church of Christ.

The Damascus Project is especially well-suited to serve the needs of small congregations, where the trend toward part-time pastorates, coupled with the shortage of authorized ministers, often requires creative thinking when it comes to filling the pulpit. A small congregation in northern Wisconsin posed this ques-

tion to its members: "Does anybody feel the Spirit calling?" A couple raised their hands. Today, they are developing their ministry and leadership skills through the Damascus Project.

The Rev. Dr. Stephanie Perdew, director of the Damascus Project, is committed to providing high-quality learning at a reasonable cost and on a flexible schedule. After a July summer break, your Council met on August 15, 2023. Below are the highlights.

**Summer Worship Time Change:** The worship service time change to 8:30 am this summer has shown very little change in attendance compared to summer 2022. It has allowed worshippers to enjoy a few more Sunday summer hours. The regular 10 am worship time will resume on September 10th.

**Safety Committee:** The committee has completed an updated Safety Brochure and handout. Safety events will start on 10/8 with an intruder class. The training is followed by a fire/tornado drill on 10/15 and CPR/AED training on 10/21. Thanks to the Safety Committee for these important updates and training opportunities.

**Rally Sunday on September 17:** Rally Sunday begins a new year with Confirmation, Sunday School and the new narrative lectionary. The children's "Quiet Room" in the back of the Sanctuary will be cleaned and arranged for Sunday School, which will be held in coordination with the worship service.

**Building Usage:** Council had a discussion regarding use of our church building for both members, non-members and outside organizations. Moderator Chad Klauer will review our current policy and the discussion will continue next month.

**Fall Cleaning:** Several areas in the church need to be cleaned out and organized, particularly the storage areas. The Council will work on getting a group together to tackle this task.

MEALS ON WHEELS
September 4—29, 2023

As you may know, "Meals on Wheels" is a community-supported program in Fort Atkinson that delivers a noon meal to elderly, homebound residents or to those who may find it difficult to prepare meals. The meals are prepared by the kitchen staff of Fort Memorial Hospital, and then delivered by volunteers from nine different churches that take turns throughout the year.

#### How can you help?

September is one of the months that our church provides volunteer drivers to deliver meals, Monday through Friday at 11:00 am, with delivery taking about one hour. The volunteers for the day will pick up the meals from Door #15, which is south of the Ambulance Entrance of the hospital on McMillen Street, along with the Schedule for each route and Driving Directions. After delivery, the empty food containers are returned to the same location at the hospital.

During the past few months, **Meals on Wheels** has delivered about 120-140 meals per week to our clients; therefore, we have two routes in the city. It is helpful to have two people for each route. If you can just drive, we can pair you up with someone who can do the extra walking.

#### So, please, give it some thought!

We need volunteers from September 4—29, 2023. You will be richly rewarded as you participate in this outreach mission of our church that has been an ongoing project for almost 50 years. Our clients are most appreciative of this service and are grateful to you for donating your time to help.


