



Council Highlights – August 2024

Telephone and Security Updates: Council received a presentation from Aaron Falk from Dimax. He proposed that our current analog system through Spectrum be updated for both the church and Childcare offices. This proposal would be updated to voice over internet utilizing the Spectrum infrastructure. New telephone sets will replace the old ones with added features that can be accessed remotely. The office has recently received phishing scams through both Pastor Sara's and Henry's email addresses. The new system will identify malicious emails, open and quarantine them. The Council reviewed and approved both upgrades. There will be a minimum monthly cost increase.

Website Proposal: Henry Harrell, Office Manager has proposed to update our website and hosting company. Our current site is slow and does not allow the user to easily update or change information. Therefore, Henry proposes a change of hosting company to GoDaddy. Henry has worked with GoDaddy and feels that it will make our site much easier to manage and avoid the need for outside consultant help. The Council approved this change.

Hoard Dinner: Hoards has requested that their annual luncheon be held in Plymouth Hall, as in previous years. The event will be on Monday, September 30. The event will be catered; therefore, no volunteers will be needed from our membership.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Sara reports that the Safe Sanctuary policy is being updated with social issues included. The Safety Team will schedule an annual fire drill and tornado training. A new group, Creation Care has started. Their focus is on sustainable recourses and environmental issues at our church and homes. There are 14 people who signed up for the Daycholah Retreat! The fall activities are being planned and a calendar will be available.

Werthmann Room: Council was presented a fabric sample and costs for valances to be added to the windows in the Werthmann Room. The council approved this addition. It was noted that we still need some artwork to be selected.

Wisconsin Conference UCC Campaign – "Forward Leadership" Several of our leaders we contacted regarding this project. The goal is to raise \$2M for the future of UCC. This includes Education, Damascus Project, Pastor Fund, Confirmation and Grants. The UCC Conference is asking for a 5-year commitment to raise \$1000 per year for this fund. They have raised \$1M so far. The council approved this commitment. There is more information on this in the Narthex.

Winter Market: Mark your calendars! The Fort Winter Market is scheduled for December 7. A committee is being put together to make sure we have another successful day!
